What an amazing year this has been! It was full of laughter, hard work, membership participation, and bonding. Thank you to Governance Board and Management Team for implementing the new cross training programs that will help to grow membership and train new volunteer leaders for the Junior League of Corpus Christi, Inc.

This year commemorates our 75th Anniversary with a signature project of installing 75 Little Free Libraries throughout our city and the surrounding Coastal Bend area. This signature project is a work in progress and we hope to have it completed by the end of summer 2019. We did this with the goal to instill the love of reading to all children and to give everyone the opportunity to have access to books. A huge thank you to our sustainers for helping to research this project and to Janice Cagle, for taking the lead in making the installation a reality.

We had a busy year serving our community through various educational programs. Our community programs include Helping Hands, R.O.C.K.E.T.S., Wave of Red, and Literacy and Learning.

Helping Hands was busy this year with several impactful projects. They partnered with Food Bank of Corpus Christi and HEB to complete the Back Pack Program. This program provided 1333 children in the Corpus Christi Independent School District with nutritional foods to sustain them through 2019 Spring Break. They organized Operation Coats and collected 250 coats for students in need at Evans Elementary.

Raising Our Children's Knowledge by Educating Through Science, better known as R.O.C.K.E.T.S., partnered with HEB Tournament of Champions to organize and host multiple after school STEM events that reached over 150 students at Oak Park and Zavala Elementary schools. They also partnered with the Museum of Science and History to host a Family Day where JLCC members coached approximately 250 students as they made flashlights, created bubbles with soap and dry ice!

Wave of Red, our outreach committee, kicked off the year helping Fish for Life with a back to school shopping spree in August at our local JC Penny, Students from West Oso ISD shopped for school clothes at no cost to their families, thanks to the generocity of Braselton Homes. Wave of Red also organized our first Day of Service honoring Martin Luther King, Jr. I want to especially thank Leslie Ruta, for recommending Day of Service as an event that JLCC needed to honor. Other service projects led by Wave of Red included helping Habitat for Humanity build a home and a cleanup of one of our beautiful beaches.

Literacy and Learning also hosted a Spring into Learning event at the Corpus Christi Public Library with a ComicCon theme with well over 800 attending the event.

Thank you to Community Council and all the chairs that organized and executed these programs flawlessly.

Our community programing is only possible through partnerships with funding partners and the efforts of our Funding Council. We created opportunities for everyone to contribute to our organization with several diverse fundraisers. This year's funding events were Pithcin' Clays, A Night in Texas, the JLCC Rummage Sale, and Touch-A-Truck.

Thank you to all our wonderful partners and sponsors. A special thanks to our Premier Sponsors. Again this year, L&F Distributers supported every effort JLCC endeavored to undertake. HEB and HEB Tournament of Champions made several events possible through financial and program support. To both the teams at L&F Distributers and HEB, we could not do the work we do without your support.

Pitching Clays was the kick-off fundraiser again this year, and gave the public an opportunity to test their skeet shooting skills or participate in a washer tournament, while also enjoying delicious barbecue and participating in a raffle.

In November, L&F Distrubtors' main warehouse was transformed into A Night in Texas, a wonderful evening event featuring a variety of culinary treats by the Texas Chef Association. This event gave you an opportunity to taste food prepared by top chefs in the Coastal Bend along with live music and silent auction.

Rummage, one of our most popular community fundraisers, allows the community to shop high end furniture, housewares, clothing, jewels and much much more at a discounted price. This year's sale opened with the usual Pre-Sale night, attended by Elvis (or a fella who looked like him!)

And finally, in March, Touch a Truck allowed children and adults the opportunity to learn about the different vehicles used around the city and in different businesses. This great event brought out 706 adults and 1236 children to the beautiful Water's Edge Park on Corpus Chirsti's beautiful bayfront. It's an event thats fun for all.

Fund Development was also hard at work holding events to supplement traditional funding events. Before the year even started, the folks at iHeart Radio invited JLCC to hold a silent auction at their fun event - Taste of the Coastal Bend. They also shared some of the profit from ticket sales with us. Thinking creatively, this committee hosted a profit share party with the generous group at the Kendra Scott in La Palmera Mall, and introduced Gift Card Balance transfer program to collect unused balances on gift cards.

Our Communication Council did an amazing job of marketing and promoting everyone of our programs and events. We thank you for your hard work. Media mentions

Membership Council did an amazing job training and hosting monthly President Lunches. Congratulations on a job well done. Membership also successfully brought 17 talented women into the JLCC sisterhood as the 2018-2019 New Member class.

While we were taking caring of our community, fundraising, and training, we decided it was time for a little change. We have moved from Hamlin Shopping Center to the new Kleberg Building located at 5350 South Staples Suite 208. This move will save us a significant amount rent and overhead costs as well.

Proceeds from Rummage Sale, as with all our fundraisers, provide funding for JLCC's community programs for the 2019 - 2020 year.












WAVE OF RED

The Wave of Red committee was born in August 2017 during the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey.

Organically, a group of volunteers planned to meet in Port Aransas to help a JLCC sister who lost her home in the storm. In the days and weeks following, an unofficial volunteer event were created to assist in the hardest hit areas of Hurricane Harvey. JLCC members gutted homes, cut through trees and sorted an endless supply of toiletries and clothing donated from other Junior Leagues throughout Texas. It was named "Wave of Red" because of the never-ending flow of red shirts that showed up to help. During the 2018 - 2019 league year, Wave of Red was formed into an

official committee and consisted of done-in-a-day projects.



Habitat for Humanity







On Saturday, October 6th, the JLCC volunteers partnered with Habitat for Humanity Corpus Christi to put some sweat equity into our community. An amazing group of women come out to volunteer and put their skills to the test using power tools for tasks such as installing siding, and caulking the entire inside of a house! These ladies set a good example of how our League comes together for the betterment of our community.

Throughout the morning, our group worked side by side with several other local organizations and worked along side the future owners of two of the homes. Hearing their stories and seeing how much time and effort they are putting into building a home that they will create memories in for years to come was a humbling experience for us all. Through these homeowners, we learned that homeowners must put in their own "sweat equity" and be at the build site when volunteers are present and building. At the end of construction, homeowners sign a mortgage that covers the cost of materials used to build the home. Those mortgage payments become funding for future homes for others. As Habitat for Humanity says, "it's a hand UP, not a handout."

Christmas Party at The Ark

On Saturday, December 1st, JLCC volunteers hosted the 2nd Annual Christmas Party for the children in emergency shelter at The Ark. The facility is the only licensed facility within an 80-mile radius where abused or neglected children can live while their cases are being assessed by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services. Children can stay at The Ark for up to 90 days, during which the staff's goal is to prepare them for successful placement in a foster home.

We spent the morning playing games like Rudolph Says, Reindeer Racing, Christmas Tree Bowling, and Santa Hat Ring Toss with the toddler group. Thanks to a generous donation by the Chick-fil-A on Saratoga, we served a scrumptious lunch and then decorated Christmas cookies. After we'd all had plenty of sugar, each child chose a stuffed animal to keep and we cozied up on the couches for story time.

When the staff whisked the sleepy children off for their naps, President of the Board, Sister Milagros Tormo, gave us a brief history of the transitional home and described typical cases—when children are removed from their homes because of continued parental drug abuse. Her stories pointed out just how much it means for young children who have experienced trauma to have one-on-one attention and consistent, compassionate care. 

This year marks the second year for the JLCC's R.O.C.K.E.T.S. committee (Raising Our Children's Knowledge Through Science) which is dedicating to improving the education of Coastal Bend students. R.O.C.K.E.T.S.strives to bring exciting and hands-on lessons in STEM fields – Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. R.O.C.K.E.T.S. was able to expand this year due to a generous grant from the HEB Tournament of Champions.

The R.O.C.K.E.T.S. committee coordinated after school workshops for 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students at Oak Park Elementary School and Zavala Elementary School. Community partners assisted with lessons designed to promote and engage the student's interest and knowledge in STEM fields. The Robotics team from Collegiate High School participated in the October workshop at Oak Park Elementary School where students were able to drive the robots; students also received Salt Water Powered Robot kits to build at home. In February, Erika Locke of the Del Mar Geology Club led the Zavala Elementary students through a lesson on dinosaurs and local fossils. Jonathan Garza of the Corpus Christi Science and History Museum coordinated a workshop in which the students were able to make and observe chemical reactions by building volcanos. Each student who participated received a STEM related take home gift.



75TH ANNIVERSARY

Celebrating 75 years of Service in Corpus Christi

The Junior League of Corpus Christi, Inc. (JLCC) celebrated 75 Years of Service in the Coastal Bend Community. To commemorate this momentous occasion, the Junior League set out to install 75 Little Free Libraries throughout the Coastal Bend. Literacy has long been a passion of the Junior League which can be seen throughout years of programs with this focus.





Little Free Library is a nonprofit organization that inspires a love of reading, builds community, and sparks creativity by fostering neighborhood book exchanges around the world. There are more than 80,000 registered Little Free Libraries in all 50 states and over 90 countries. Through these Libraries, millions of books are exchanged each year, profoundly increasing access to books for readers of all ages and backgrounds. Little Free Library has received recognition from the Library of Congress, the National Book Foundation, Library Journal, the Women's National Book Association, and more.

Donations from JLCC members & community business sponsors raised over \$22,000 to build 62 of the 75 Little free Libraries that will be installed this Spring. The other 13 will be hand crafted and designed by individuals and local organizations and then will be judged and awarded prizes based on creativity.

Volunteers from around the community donated their time to help assemble and install these libraries in local parks, schools, churches and area neighborhoods from Calallen to Padre Island. In collaboration with Texas A&M University - Corpus Christi's "The Big Event" 155 student volunteers assembled 55 of the Little Free Library Kits.

Sustainer Janice Cagle was an integral figure in leading this massive undertaking. She secured sponsors, storage locations for the kits, arranged volunteers to build the kits and organized and installed each library. Additionally, she brought in the support of Councilman Ben Molina and the Corpus Christi Parks and Rec Department. The Junior League received an overwhelming amount of media coverage regarding the 75th anniversary project to help garner community support.

2018 - 2019 New Member Project


