Letter from the President:

Stefany Schade



To my fellow Junior League members, actives, sustainers, community partners, and all of the wonderful people that are part of this community. Thank you!

Thank you for making this last year such a wonderful time for our organization and for our community. You all have done such an amazing job, and I am so honored and proud to be affiliated with such an amazing group of people.

We started the year off with a bang, with a phenomenal speaker, Mrs. Bonita Owens. We ended the year with a celebration of all of our accomplishments, wrapping up the year with the amazing Mrs. Sara Longoria speaking at our Annual Meeting.

We rolled out a brand-new event this last year, our Radiothon event, labeled Make Waves, because Junior League women in red make waves everywhere that they go. I am so proud of the committee who undertook this endeavor. They created this event from scratch, they planned, organized, and executed with precision, and as a result, we reached over 19,000 people in the city, educating them about who and what the Junior League of Corpus Christi is. We did a spotlight on 16 members, had 240 radio spots on 5 different stations, and raised over \$7,000 to help our organization.

We then had our tried-and-true event, Christmas Tree Forest – a favorite for so many Junior Leaguers, community advocates, and the City. This last year's Christmas Tree Forest broke some records with over 2,000 visitors, 163 volunteer hours, and 34 volunteers. It was a beautiful event that brought the whole community together to experience the joy and love of the season. Well done ladies!!!

Then in February, we had our ROCKETS event at the Museum of Science and History, where we showcased 8 difference science stations and 7 different science exhibitors; we had over 180 volunteer hours, 40 volunteers, and a record-breaking attendance of 1,511 visitors. This was an amazing event, with the Museum being filled with kids, experiencing science and history and all wonderful things that the Junior League of Corpus Christi does for our community. There was so much joy and passion in the air, watching the kids run around and knowing that Junior League provided that experience for them.



Next was our New Member Project and our new members this year did an amazing job. They provided over 1,000 “Backpacks” to children with food insecurity during the week of Spring Break. The backpacks were filled with food, pens, paper, chalk, and more goodies, to help them get through the week. The new member class raised over \$17,000 with 28 volunteers. Congratulations ladies! Y’all did an amazing job!!!

And our last big event of the year was Touch-a-Truck. The committee put together an amazing event, gathering 60 trucks and exhibitors, and raising approximately \$25,000. We had 150 volunteer hours and over 40 volunteers, but the cherry on top of the icing on this beautiful cake, was that we have 3,365 visitors to experience Touch-a-Truck this year — another record-breaking number of community visitors attending a Junior League event.

But wait, there’s more. We also had 9 different Wave of Red events to improve our community. These are Board-led events, similar to past done-in-a-day events, that help different organizations around the City. We partnered with 7 different nonprofit organizations, with over 200 volunteer hours to make a lasting impact in our community.

But hold on, I’m not done. We also had a great array of professional training and development at our General Meetings. We had 6 different speakers, training on Junior League technology and benefits, a TedTalk on how to avoid burn out and a great nonprofit speaker panel, as well as AJLI Leadership conferences which were attended by members.

Overall, this last year was just an amazing, heart-warming, GREAT year where women experienced new things, made new friends, reconnected with old friends, and not only made an impactful difference in the community, but a difference in themselves and in their League sisters.

It has been my greatest honest and pleasure to serve as the President of the Junior League of Corpus Christi during the 2021-2022 year. Thank you so much for the opportunity and I absolutely cannot wait to see what the years ahead have in store for this amazing organization!

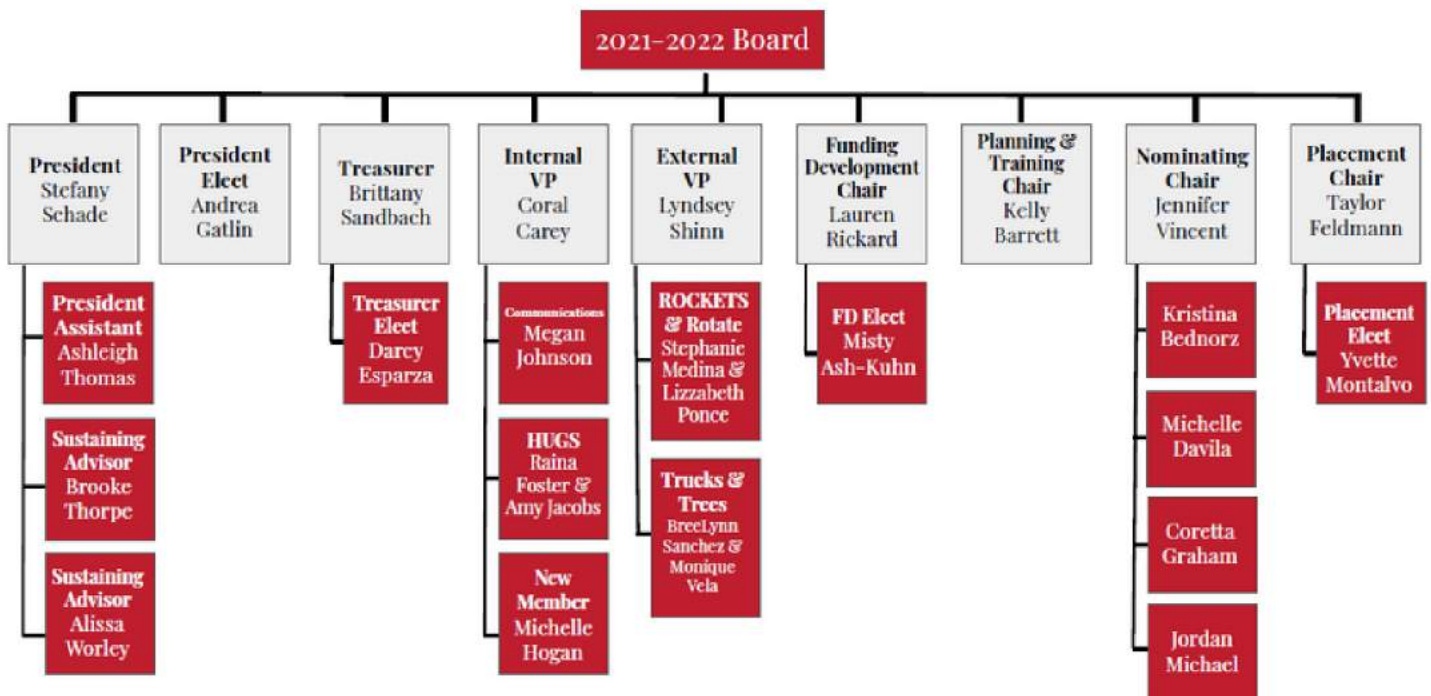

Make Waves

Make Waves was a brand-new event for the JLCC this year! The event was comprised of a radio campaign, in partnership with iHeart Radio Corpus Christi, a silent auction, and a social media campaign.

In partnership with iHeart Radio, members recorded interviews and commercials to air on five radio stations to promote the women and the impact of the league. The commercials also served as a call to action for community participation in the Make Waves online silent auction. To gather items for the online auction, Leaguers also had the opportunity to make connections



with community partners, tell them more about the JLCC, and encourage them to provide auction items.

The impacts of the Make Waves event were numerous! Not only was over \$7,600 raised, but the League also received numerous applications from women interested in joining the JLCC, and there were more than 40 unique bidders seen on the online auction. Finally, the social media campaign reached over 19,000 people with over 2,400 engagements and 125,000 impressions!

This year marked the 4th Annual Touch-A-Truck event! This event is a free, family-centric event providing children of the community a hands-on opportunity to explore working trucks of all types, as well as meet the people who build, protect, and serve the Coastal Bend communities.

There were a variety of trucks available for kids to explore: emergency response vehicles, construction trucks, farming equipment, military vehicles, city work vehicles, and more! Besides the trucks, the community could visit food trucks, get their face painted, or visit local vendors and business who had tables set up around the perimeter of the event.



Endowment Fund

An endowment fund is a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding where the contributions are tax-deductible and the resulting investment income is used for a specific purpose.

The Junior League of Corpus Christi began its Endowment Fund in 1990 with a floor of \$100,000. Each year, any earnings in excess of the endowment floor are used to help pay for general and administrative expenses. In the 2015-2016 League Year, the floor was increased to \$1,000,000 to keep pace with our growing League and economic needs.
